What does it mean to lead like a Methodist? How do we form ethical leaders for the public life? What kind of leadership does the global church need in the 21st century?

You are invited to join with Methodist and Wesleyan leaders and scholars from around the world to debate these questions and work together on what it means to lead and form leaders in our multiple contexts today.

Focusing in turn on leading in public life, in the church and in education, scholars and practitioners from different continents will share experiences of peace-making in war torn countries, of decolonizing curriculum in the global south, of leading the church through conflict and change, and of pioneering new forms of ministry.

In small groups we will reflect together on the theological principles of the Methodist heritage with the aim of learning from one another and from our shared history as we face the challenges of leadership in our own roles and contexts today, identifying topics and projects of common interest that can support leaders and the formation of leaders into the future.
