A creative and professional training for experienced supervisors who want to or already offer group supervision.



Attention will be paid to group formation, cohesion, intercultural and power dynamics.

Participants will engage in group exercises, reflect on demonstrations in the light of the theories taught and practise leading groups.

Course Leaders

Diane Clutterbuck is a very experienced supervisor and trainer in the church and public and voluntary organisations in both The UK and Ireland. From 2015-2021 she was part of a team introducing supervision for all ministers in the Methodist Church in Britain. This has



included developing training and policy. In 2017-18 and 2019 she was a tutor at Wesley House. From 2017-2021 she worked with Jane Leach to develop and deliver the Certificate and Diploma courses in supervision. She says:

The wisdom and insight of the group far out ways the contribution of each individual and a group energy is generated which can make the exploration of the supervision question a deeply transformatory experience for everyone. This course will take each participants supervisory practice to a new level."

Jane Leach is an APSE accredited senior supervisor and trainer. She was the founding chair of APSE and is the author of A Charge to Keep, and, with Michael Paterson, of Pastoral Supervision: A Handbook. She holds a diploma in creative supervision methods from the London Centre for Psychodrama. She is



an ordained Methodist presbyter, serving as the Principal of Wesley House. She has more than 15 years experience of teaching pastoral supervision and has developed training materials for use in Britain, the USA and Kenya. She researches and supervises academic research in this field.

"It has been so energising to put this course together and I really look forward to sharing the learning with other participants. This course will strengthen the skillset of anyone engaging in reflective practice with groups in a pastoral setting."

Course details

- 5 intensive face to face days followed by ongoing online supervision groups (6 x 2 hours at monthly intervals) run by the course leaders.
- Prior to the start of the taught component about 16 hours of preparation is needed, including identifying 6-8 people who are willing to form a pastoral supervision group for the trainee to lead for six months and reflect on during the course.
- The course will be assessed by a portfolio that tracks the development and leadership of the trainee-led supervision group.
- In total the course will provide 120 hours of continuing professional development.
