Action for Children Report to Synod Autumn 2024

Action for Children celebrated its 155th anniversary this year. We are thankful for the privilege to do this important work in partnership with our amazing Methodist Church supporters alongside other churches and organisations.

Thank you for all the ways you get involved – from taking part in Count Your Blessings, to holding an Action for Children Sunday service, and signing campaigns like Children at The Table to praying. The supporter-led fundraising events always show so much creativity and passion. Methodists have also taken part in many other fundraising events, such as the London Marathon and Great North Run.

We are always excited to meet our church supporters face-to-face. Earlier this year, we attended the Methodist Women in Britain residential in Swanwick and the Methodist Conference in Leeds. Thank you for welcoming us at these events and others.

687,755 people reached in 2023/2024

Action for Children's vision is to ensure that children have safe and happy childhoods. We have more than 400 services in local communities across the UK, including children centres and support services to help families prevent and reverse child neglect and abuse. We also have an online service called Parent Talk.

In 2023/2024, we reached 687,755 children, young people and families through all our services. These figures are lower than the previous year because fewer people used Parent Talk. However, the number of young people and children we reached through face-to-face services increased by 1%.

Sister Eluned Williams MBE

Our staff are a great asset to our charity, selflessly supporting children and families and making lifechanging impact. We were very sad to hear that Sister Eluned Williams MBE, one of our last Methodistordained 'Sisters of the Children' passed away in May 2024. This is a huge loss - she was not just a former staff member who had worked for Action for Children for 44 years; she remained a tireless advocate for children and an ambassador for the charity.

They were recognised for giving the young person who has been in their care for eight years exceptional support to work through their experiences of loss and trauma, get an education and make commendable progress. The young person has won awards and even set up a business. Being a foster carer is a huge commitment and we are grateful for foster carers like Angela and Nick who create a safe and happy place for children to thrive.

Faith Space launched

Last July, we launched Faith Space – a quarterly online meeting for our incredible Methodist and church supporters. We created this space for them to hear about the huge difference their support makes, connect and inspire each other. A huge thanks to everyone who took part in it or has signed up.

At the first event, our Chief Executive, Paul Carberry, gave an update on our work and his meetings with Methodists. He also asked those who attended to convey his thanks to their churches. The event also featured talks about Tan Y Bryn residential home and our policy and campaigning work to influence government. Lifelong supporter, Liz Bishop spoke about her motivation for supporting the charity, and the remarkable ways she and her church raise funds, including a walk that raised over £2,500 this year.

New partnership with Nationwide

In July, we launched our exciting new three-year partnership with Nationwide Building Society, aimed at tackling child poverty. Through Nationwide's Fairer Futures programme, we will provide a vital lifeline to tens of thousands of vulnerable children, young people and families. Our partnership will provide crucial support across the UK through two key programmes:

- **The Family Fund** will give families immediate, flexible support with essentials like food, bills, clothing and equipment for their homes. Children will also be



able to have activities and experiences that they otherwise would not have, such as a trip to the zoo, or a birthday cake.

- **Family Clubs** will provide welcoming, safe spaces in local communities where families can come to eat, get warm, feel comfortable and get support with whatever they are facing. They will provide the essential wrap-around support.

New JoJo Maman Bébé partnership

We are also delighted to announce a new partnership with JoJo Maman Bébé starting from August 2024. The year-long partnership, which aims to raise at least £60,000 in unrestricted donations through staff and customer activities, will make a real impact for children and young people.

Our next policy campaign focusing on children in care kicks off on 9 September with four new policy reports (for England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales), as a well as a 'four nations', young person-friendly report, about what makes a good home for children in care.

Every 15 minutes, a child goes into care in the UK. They've already faced huge challenges in their young lives. And now they are in care, the world can see them differently. Our campaign will be calling on the UK governments to take immediate action on children's social care, so that children in care get the high-quality homes, love and support they need to thrive.
